A Letter from the DC Dental Society President Thomas Sokoly, DDS

I hope you all had a nice summer. In July, the Board of Directors met and agreed to move forward with the 2017 Mid-Atlantic Dental Meeting. Traditionally, the annual meeting has been the key revenue driver for the organization. However, over the past several years, revenue has dropped, and in 2016, there was a

dramatic dip in attendance due to several factors, resulting in the meeting losing money for the first time in recent memory. After much analysis and deliberation, the Board approved holding the 2017 Mid-Atlantic Dental Meeting because we believe that the value the meeting brings to our members, their dental teams and the local dental community outweighs the possible financial downside of holding the event next year. I want to thank the efforts and hard work of the Mid-Atlantic Dental Meeting Committee, Advisory Committee to the Mid-Atlantic Dental Meeting, Finance and Advisory Committee, Executive Committee, Board and staff. Over the past several months, these member volunteers have met numerous times to thoughtfully consider the best path forward for the Annual Meeting. We are excited for the many changes being implemented for the 2017 event, including a new two-day format, a flat registration fee for all non-workshop courses making it cost-effective for dentists to bring their dental teams, lower cost hands-on workshops, and more formal and informal opportunities for attendees to network.

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

Department of Health Wants DCDS Member Input

The District of Columbia Department of Health's Oral Health Program (DOH OHP) is assessing factors that influence the delivery of primary oral health care in the District of Columbia. As part of this assessment, the DOH OHP is interviewing dentists regarding factors that include preventive care delivery, dental services for special populations, participation in health professions loan repayment programs, the dental safety net, and more. The information collected from these interviews will help us to develop programs that support general and pediatric dentists in enhancing oral health outcomes among District residents.

Revisions to DCDS Bylaws to Allow Mail and Online Balloting

At the direction of the DCDS leadership, the Constitution and Bylaws Committee was charged with recommending an amendment to the Society's bylaws that would allow eligible members the opportunity to vote by mail or online ballot. Currently, all DCDS members must appear in person to cast a ballot for contested Society leadership and ADA House of Delegate positions. The recommended amendment/revisions to the bylaws below strive to give more members the opportunity to participate in the democratic process of electing officers and in deciding issues. Membership will vote at the September Monthly Meeting, September 13 at 5:45 p.m.

Committee Recommend Updates to DCDS Bylaws

13.0 CHAPTER XIII - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

13.10 PROCEDURE

- **13.11** Nominations for elections to any position or office with the exception of the President and General Chair of the NCDM shall be made at a designated business meeting and the election shall be held at a following appropriate announced meeting.
- **13.11.1** An eligible member may vote by mail or online ballot, or any other means of electronic transmission approved by the Board of Directors. ¹
- **13.12** All members of the Society must be notified at least two (2) weeks before the election of the names of the candidates nominated of for the various elective offices and positions. **13.13** A ballot sheet, when required for a contested election shall be printed made available with
- the names of the candidates nominated for the various elective offices and positions.²

13.20 TIMES OF NOMINATION

- **13.21** Nominations for elective offices of the Society shall be made at a business meeting at least two months prior to any election.
- **13.22** Nominations for delegates and alternate delegates to the American Dental Association House of Delegates shall be made at a regular business meeting immediately after the annual ADA House of Delegates meeting and at least two (2) months prior to the election. which will take place at a business meeting.³

Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office

September Monthly Meeting

The next DC Dental Society monthly meeting will be held Tuesday, September 13th at the Westin Georgetown and will feature a presentation by Dr. Stephen Wilson titled "Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office".

Session Abstract

Estimates of the number of emergencies that occur in dental practices vary. The most frequently reported emergency is syncope; however, other relatively frequent emergencies involve hypoglycemia, seizures, angina, choking, asthma, and swallowing of foreign objects. This presentation will present an overview of relatively frequent emergencies and possible intervention strategies associated with the prevention of emergencies and with rescuing of patients. Because pharmacological management of pediatric (and other patients) appears to be increasing, emergency management of more frequent sedation emergencies, their prevention, and management will be discussed.

Learning Objectives

The attendees of this lecture should become more aware of general types of emergencies in dental practice. They will be able to:

- 1. Discuss the more frequent emergencies that occur in dental practices.
- 2. Discuss general principles associated with prevention of emergencies.
- 3. Discuss intervention strategies associated with rescuing patients during specific "common" emergencies.
- 4. Review and implement changes, as needed, in their current practice policy on emergency management of their patients and staff.



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HIV Testing... at the Dental Office?

More than 16,000 District residents are infected with HIV—that is 2.5% of its population. The epidemic disproportionately affects African-Americans and males. Men are diagnosed with HIV three times that of women in the District while the prevalence of HIV among African-Americans are 3.5 times that of Whites. Furthermore, the prevalence among black males is 2.5 times that of White males while Black women in the District contract HIV 24 times that of White women. What can we do about it?

In 2006, The CDC implemented recommendations around routine HIV screening, emphasizing that ALL patients between the ages of 13 and 64 be screened annually for HIV. However, the DC Department of Health broadened this age range to 84 as the epidemic shifted towards an older population, locally.


Dental examinations remain an untapped opportunity for HIV screening as it was revealed in one study that people are more likely to regularly visit dentists than other HIV testing facilities—overall, an estimated 58-75% of the US population sees a dentist annually. Furthermore, many dentists are already conducting primary screening efforts like hypertension, oral cancer, and elevated blood glucose screenings, thus HIV screening would give dentists another opportunity to further integrate oral and primary care health systems.

By implementing HIV testing in dental facilities, dentists may achieve practice enhancement; better patient health outcomes as they become more aware of complications that invasive and common dental procedures might add to HIV+patients' health; an ability to maximize reimbursements for testing and counseling; and ultimately being able to access a group of people who would never test on their own. Ultimately, more people will know their HIV status contributing to a decline in HIV transmission. 
