Letter from the DC Dental Society President Ioana "Anna" Bettios, DDS, MS, FACP, FICD, FACD

Dear Colleagues,

Your DC Dental Society is working diligently to represent you and bring you programs that will support your practice. A top priority for DCDS is advocating on your behalf before the DC Board of Dentistry and the DC Council on critical issues including staffing shortages, the lengthy pro-

cess for dental professionals to secure a new license and scope of practice for dentists, dental hygienists and dental assistants. In the District, a new Council was seated in January, and the annual process of conducting oversight hearings has begun. On February 28 DCDS testified at an oversight hearing on licensing boards that was held by the DC Council Committee Health (read testimony). In addition, DCDS recently joined with other DC healthcare organizations to raise concerns with the DC Department of Healthcare Finance about payment delays for Medicaid claims and delays in the credentialing process. The memo also calls upon the department to require Medicaid MCOs to report additional statistics on claims processing to evaluate trends (read memo).

In our testimony we highlighted the staffing shortage and recommended a number of legislative actions that could be taken by the Council to improve the licensing process, including DC joining the new interstate licensing compact for dentists and dental hygienists, rescinding the requirement that all dental assistants be registered, and eliminating the "clean hands" requirement or raising the threshold that prevents a person from applying for a license until all moneys owed to the DC government have been paid. We also testified to the long delays and difficulties that many dental professionals experienced before their license was issued. We will continue to represent DC dentists on these critical issues until they are resolved.

DCDS: Advocating on Your Behalf

On February 28, DCDS Executive Director Kurt Gallagher, CAE testified during the DC Council Committee on Health's Oversight Hearing on Medical Boards. The testimony highlighted the staffing challenges that DC dental practices are experiencing, and how delays in the issuing of licenses and registrations is worsening staffing shortages. The testimony called for a number of actions to ease the tight market for staffing by updating the licensing process, including:

- DC joining the new licensing compact for dentists and dental hygienists.
- Repealing the requirement that Level I dental assistance register with the Board of Dentistry.
- Eliminating the "clean hands" requirement for licensee applicants.
- Easing the requirements to allow on-the-job training for dental assistants and dental hygienists.
- Improving communication by DC Health with applicants in the event an application is missing elements.
- Reducing the timeframe to update licenses applications when new information is provided.
- Requiring DC Health to report meaningful statistics on the licensure process, including:
 - The number and percentage of applications that are approved after a manual review.
 - The number and percentage of applications that are in process, including:
 - A breakdown of the number of days passed from the date of submission by the applicant.
 - A breakdown on the cause of delay, such as whether an applicant lacks "clean hands" or whether a specific type of documentation is pending receipt.

Dr. Chaviano Moran is Rutgers School of Dental Medicine, RSDM, Associate Dean for Admissions and Associate professor in the Departments of Periodontics and Community Health. She is coauthor for the MetLife's Quality Resource Guide Caring for LGBTQ+ Individuals in Dental Practice.



Herminio L. Perez, DMD, MBA, EdD—Co-Presenter on LGBTQ+ Cultural Competency Dr. Perez received his dental degree from Rutgers School of Dental Medicine, followed by a General Practice Residency at BronxLebanon Hospital. After residency, he continued the Hospital affiliation as a faculty and Site Administrator in the Department of Dentistry. Dr. Perez received his MBA in Healthcare Systems from the Silberman College of Business, Fairleigh Dickinson University, N.J.

In addition, Dr. Perez received his doctoral degree in education with a concentration in Leadership and Innovation from the NYU Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, and Human Development.

Dr. Perez serves as the Assistant Dean of StudentAffairs, Diversity & Inclusion, and Assistant Professor in the Department of Restorative Dentistry at the Rutgers School of Dental Medicine.

In addition to his academic and administrative responsibilities, He is a member of the Diversity Leadership Council at Rutgers Biomedical Health Sciences, where he co-chairs the sections of the Antiracist Taskforce and the RBHS University-wide Diversity Strategic Planning Process. In 2021, Dr. Perez was appointed as a Member of the American Dental Association Board of Trustees' Diversity and Inclusion Committee.

Dr. Perez has been an active member of the American Dental Education Association (ADEA) and has served as Chair of the Student Affairs/ Financial Aid Section (AFASA). Sterling V. Mead Award

The Sterling V. Mead Award is given annually to an active, active life or retired member of the Society in good standing who has made distinguished contributions to the dental profession and/or has devoted their life to organized dentistry. This may include outstanding contributions to (1) the DC Dental Society and/or the ADA, (2) the dental profession, (3) dental education, (4) dental or oral health research and (5) civic organizations that support oral health

The award is named after Dr. Sterling V. Mead, a distinguished dentist, past D.C. Dental Society member and author who wrote several books on dentistry between 1935 and 1954, including Oral Surgery, Diseases of the Mouth and Anesthesia in Dental Surgery.



ADA responds to criticism of medical loss ratio policies

ADA Morning Huddle, February 27, 2023

The National Association of Dental Plans Executive Director Mike Adelberg said laws making dental insurance plans adhere to medical loss ratio requirements are "bad public policy that will not achieve intended consumer and dental community benefits," but the ADA's Chad Olson countered that these policies are "a consumer protection that's needed and timely." Massachusetts voters approved a medical loss ratio ballot issue in November, with \$5.5 million in assistance from the ADA, while a number of additional states are considering similar proposals this year. "With consumers more conscious of their pocketbooks than ever, they deserve to get as much out of the premiums they pay for dental insurance as possible," said Olson, who is the ADA's director of state government affairs.

Md. lawmakers consider legislation to expand access to dental care

Maryland legislators introduced <u>House Bill 290</u> and <u>Senate Bill 237</u>, which would require parents or caregivers to show proof to the state's public school system or to child care facilities that a child has had a dental screening. The legislation would create requirements and eligibility standards for dental services and reimbursements in the state's Medicaid program and expand the Higher Education Loan Assistance Grant program in the state to include dental hygienists.


