Letter from the DC Dental Society President Ladan Basiri, MA, DMD

Dear Colleagues,

September has been a very busy month with our first virtual business meeting, the passing of Amendment I to the DCDS bylaws, our first monthly meeting, the board and Finance Committee meetings to develop our FY21 budget, and all of our committee meetings. I want to thank our members who took the time out of

their busy lives to attend the Zoom business meeting and vote on the content of our bylaws. I also want to thank our Finance Committee, especially our wonderful treasurer Dr. Gene Giannini, and our executive director, Mr. Kurt Gallagher, for working diligently on our new budget.

I am pleased to announce on behalf of the board of directors that the budget includes a 50% rebate off the DCDS portion of annual dues for 2020 members that renew next year. For a member paying full active dues, that will be a reduction of \$335. This is a small way that DCDS can support and thank our members through the current crisis. The FY21 Budget also supports innovative programs like our digital transformation, which enables our society to continue programs in a manner that promotes public health while also fostering interactions over digital media.

As the pandemic continues, we continue to adapt. One of COVID's principal impacts has been on the way states regulate continuing education (CE), as well as on the way dental societies and associations deliver programs to its professionals. We all have an immense amount of information we need to learn for 2020, and the fastest and most efficient way to get that information is the internet. Many state dental boards have either allowed for exemptions or made changes to their CE protocols to permit livestreamed instruction to replace annual conferences and lecture halls. Hundreds of dentists are flocking to the same webinar or Zoom call to not only earn continuing education hours, but also connect with and ask questions to industry leaders. Livestreamed CE has made it easier than ever for all members of the dental team to get

on the same page, and despite most of our offices being open again, online learning can bring us and our teams even closer together. The possibilities are endless, and realistically speaking, online CE for the entire team is here to stay. That is not to say that it will replace in-person conferences, but this digital element adds a new medium for staying current on industry news, policies, and changes in uncertain times like these. In addition, live streaming online courses allows us to interact with the presenters and with each other by asking questions, hearing answers in real time, and discussing topics via chat together and with panelists.

For DC dentists, during the September meeting of the DC Dental Board of Dentistry the following changes to CE requirements for the 2020-2021 license renewal cycle were affirmed:

- 1. The Board of Dentistry confirmed that the required 1 hour of ethics and 2 hours of LGBTQ cultural competency will satisfy the requirement that 10% of CE (3 hours) be in topics designated as public health priorities.
- 2. The Board announced that an emergency regulation lifting the limit on CE earned through online courses that can be counted towards the next licensure renewal would be <u>published on the DC Register</u> on September 18. The text of this proposed rule is available via the "View text" link on the DC Register website.
 - a. Because it is an emergency regulation, it will expire in January 2021.
 - b. A final regulation lifting the limit on online CE will be passed by January before the emergency rule expires.
- 3. The Board voted to accept online CPR courses as satisfying the CPR requirement. It was noted that the American Heart Association offers an online course, and this will be accepted under the upcoming final regulation. Stay tuned!

During the September monthly meeting, members had a chance to vote for two amendments to the DCDS bylaws. Amendment I passed and Amendment II did not.

Provisions of Amendment I included:

- Establishing a more efficient committee structure that reflects current DCDS activities
- Removing references to the Mid-Atlantic Meeting and acknowledging the Symposium Committee
- Putting the chair of the Symposium Committee on par with other committee chairs; the chair is no longer designated as a special board position
- Clarifying the awards nomination process to specifically allow members to make nominations
- Increasing the quorum threshold from 10% to 15%
- Clarifying the board nomination process to specifically allow members to make nominations
- Clarifying the role of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee in the bylaws amendment process

Amendment II would have raised the term limit for members of the DCDS delegation to the ADA from 16 to 20 years.

I want to direct your attention to our educational and wellness webinars in September and October. On September 24, we had the pleasure of learning from dental life coach Dr. Uche Odiatu on how to improve our lifestyle habits and, therefore, our healing ability. A recording of that webinar is available for playback on the DCDS website. Presentation of Dr. Uche's webinar was funded under a grant from the ADA. On October 13, our monthly webinar on oral pathology will be presented by Dr. Kitrina Cordell, "Can You Identify These 20 Lesions?" On October 20, we will learn how to breathe better under our PPE with Panayama yoga instructor Jill Holland. On October 15-17, we have the opportunity to attend the ADA/FDC Virtual Connect Conference – for more information, please visit ADA.org/meeting.

Additionally, if the politics of dentistry interest you, this is a golden opportunity to attend hearings of the House of Delegates – any member of the ADA (regardless of being a member of the House of Delegates) has the right to attend and participate in the discussion during the reference committee hearings. The House of Delegates will convene on October 15 at 9:30 A.M Central Time, and registration for the ADA virtual House of Delegates and reference committee hearings in mid-October is open today. ADA members who are not members of the House of Delegates and nonmembers of the association may view the livestream broadcast of House meetings and reference committee hearings by registering at ADA.org/HODReg. Due to the virtual nature of the 2020 meeting, ADA members and nonmembers who register for the livestream broadcast of the virtual reference committee hearings and who wish to testify must submit written testimony by the close of business on October 12. Please visit ADA.org/writtentestimony for instructions on how to submit written testimony and to download the reference committee written testimony template.

I want to thank the DCDS delegates and the alternate delegates for working so hard on our behalf. Most importantly, I thank you, our amazing members, for your understanding and compassion during this time. With a hopeful eye towards the future, I wish you a fall season full of good health, and I hope to see you soon.

Free N95 Fit Tests Courtesy of the Montgomery County Health Department

The Montgomery County Health Department's dental program is offering a free fit test for you and your clinical staff as a professional courtesy. The fit test will be conducted by a dental hygienist on staff who is a certified fit tester, Beth McKinney, RDH, MS.

Required Medical Clearance: Prior to scheduling your fit test you will need a medical clearance from a health care professional. The form for the medical clearance is available on the OSHA website.

If you do not have a primary health care provider, on option is to contact Respiratory Safety, a company in California that provides the clearance by telemedicine for a small fee (approx. \$22). The company can be reached at www.respsafety.com or 877-255-5757.

To schedule a fit test for you and your clinical staff, contact Jessica Rivera by calling 240-777-4512.

Fit Test Location: 1401 Rockville Pike, 3rd Floor Dental Clinic, Rockville, Md. Parking in the garage is free with validation.

Be sure to bring the respirator with you for which you want to be fit tested. The fit test is only good for that particular model of respirator.

HHS Announces Phase 3 of Provider Relief Fund

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services is allocating \$20 billion in new funding for health care providers, including many dentists. The Provider Relief Fund was established by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act — known as the CARES Act — and allows dental providers to apply for payments made for health care-related expenses or lost revenue attributable to the pandemic. The funds, distributed through the Health Resources and Services Administration, is part of the Phase 3 General Provider Relief Fund. Eligible dentists can begin applying for funds Oct. 5 through Nov. 6.

Tips To Address "Bad Mask Breath"

In a consumer-focused article, <u>LiveStrong</u> (9/29, Levine) outlined several ways to help alleviate "bad mask breath," such as maintaining proper oral hygiene, dealing with dry mouth, and cleaning masks frequently. The article also said "foods such as garlic and onions can cause foul breath because, even once they're digested, the chemicals that cause their odor are absorbed into your bloodstream and from there into your lungs, where they are exhaled, according to the <u>American Dental Association</u>."

Dentists can refer patients to MouthHealthy.org, ADA's consumer website, for information on <u>bad</u> breath causes and solutions.

The ADA provides a complete list of <u>toothpastes</u> with the ADA Seal of Acceptance, including some with <u>bad breath control</u> attributes. In addition, <u>ClōSYS Alcohol-Free Oral Health Rinse (unflavored & gentle mint)</u> and <u>TheraBreath Fresh Breath Oral Rinse (mild mint, invigorating icy mint, rainforest mint)</u> have earned the ADA Seal for helping to reduce bad breath.

Preventive Dental Care May Lower Risk Of Ventilator-Associated Pneumonia, Study Finds

<u>Becker's Dental Review</u> (9/24, Adams) reported a new <u>study</u> found that "patients who maintain routine dental care are less likely to acquire ventilator-associated pneumonia." For the study, "DentaQuest used the IBM Watson MarketScan Medicaid Database to analyze inpatient administrative claims data for Medicaid ICU patients from 2016 to 2018," finding "patients with at least one preventive dental visit within three years of being placed on a ventilator are 22 percent less likely to be diagnosed with ventilator-associated pneumonia than those who did not."


