Letter from DC Dental Society President Cheryle Baptiste, DDS, FICD, FIAMDI

Dear Members of the DC Dental Society,

As we reflect on the rich history of dentistry in America, it's fascinating to recall that Paul Revere, renowned for his midnight ride, was also an early American dentist. Revere not only placed advertisements in local newspapers offering his dental services but also made a significant contribution to dental forensics by identifying a friend post-mortem through a bridge he constructed. This marks the first known case of

post-mortem dental forensics.

In colonial times, dentistry was not recognized as a profession, with barbers or black-smiths often performing extractions. During the American Revolution, soldiers suffered greatly from dental problems due to poor nutrition and lack of hygiene. Recognizing this, George Washington mandated the issuance of toothbrushes to soldiers, emphasizing the importance of dental health for military readiness.

Celebrations and Acknowledgments

July offers several opportunities to celebrate and raise awareness. International Kissing Day on July 6th reminds us of the importance of oral health in maintaining confidence and hygiene. The week of July 14th marks Nonbinary Awareness Week, culminating in International Nonbinary People's Day on July 14th, and July 16th is International Drag Day. Let us embrace these moments to recognize and support diversity within our community.

In June, we celebrated Caribbean American Heritage Month, recognizing the profound contributions of Caribbean Americans to the United States. My father, who hailed from Grenada, West Indies, arrived in the US in 1950 with only \$12 and a dream of attending Howard University. Eight years later, he graduated from the Howard University College of Dentistry in 1958. Students from the Caribbean often face financial challenges without federal scholarships, loans, or funding. Advocacy Update

Hearing on Specialty License Proposal is July 10

Authorization for Botox also under consideration

DCDS and members dentists are preparing to testify during a hearing of the DC Council Committee on Health on July 10 to oppose a proposal to require all specialist dentists to obtain a specialty license and maintain board certification in order to practicing openly in DC as a specialist. DCDS estimates that approximately half of all specialist dentists overall would be ineligible to secure a specialty license because of the board certification requirement. This proposal is included in the Dental Specialties Licensure and Scope of Practice Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-0632).

The deadline to register as a witness is 4:59 PM on Monday, July 8 (see link to right). The hearing on Wednesday, July 10, will begin at 9:30 AM, although the exact time that the committee will take up the Dental Specialties Act is uncertain because of other items on the agenda. Originally the hearing was scheduled to be held in person. To avoid logistical and security complications related to the NATO summit that will be held in DC next week, now the July 10 hearing will be held exclusively over Zoom.

It is important that DC dentists testify at the hearing to explain the devastating, long term impact this proposal would have on the number of dentists practicing in DC and consequently on the health and well-being of the public.

The legislation also include a provision to authorize dentists to administer FDA approved neurotoxins (e.g., BOTOX), but only for dental purposes. DCDS is advocating for a broader authorization to allow dentists with proper training to administer these substances, along with dermal fillers, for cosmetic as well as dental purposes.

DCDS Advocacy and Updates

Thank you to everyone who participated in our recent DCDS Town Hall Zoom and those who plan to testify during the July 10th hearing on the Dental Specialties Licensure and Scope of Practice Amendment Act of 2023 (B25-0632, "Specialty Act"). DCDS has been informed that the DC Department of Health will request an amendment to the legislation, providing a pathway to licensure for specialists who have completed a CODA accredited residency program. This proposed change addresses our primary concern, but continued support and testimony are crucial to ensure our voices are heard. Our testimony will also advocate for the administration of FDA-approved neurotoxins and dermal fillers by dentists for cosmetic as well as dental purposes following the necessary training.

We congratulate Dr. Chanelle A. Roberts and Dr. Imani E. Lewis, the newest members of the DC Board of Dentistry, as well as Dr. Jonelle Anamelechi and Dr. Eric Bradshaw who are nominated to the board and pending confirmation by the DC Council. We also extend our gratitude to Dr. John Bailey and Dr. Iris Jeffries Morton for their years of dedicated service as they reach their term limits.

DCDS supports the proposed changes to the Clean Hands legislation, which would exempt the issuance of occupational and business licenses from the requirement of owing no more than \$100 to the DC government. This legislation, pending action by the DC Council, will raise the clean hands threshold from \$100 to \$2,500 and could help our members by significantly expanding the pool of potential candidates to fill staff vacancies.

We have been meeting with DC Healthcare Finance regarding the need to increase fees paid to dentists for covered dental procedures under the DC Medicaid program. They have asked us to voluntarily participate in a Dental Advisory Group.

Special thanks to Mr. Kurt Gallagher (DCDS ED) and his staff, Ms. Cheryl Michi, Ms. Maeceon Lewis and Mr. Guy Nagbe, for their unwavering dedication and hard work in addressing the concerns of our profession and the public.





CONTROL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA COMURIEL BOWSER, MAYOR



On March 15, 2024, the District of Columbia Department of Health (DC Health) will accept applications for the Health Professional Loan Repayment Program (HPLRP). The program provides loan repayment services to eligible providers practicing in HPLRP-certified Service Obligation Sites (SOS) in the District.

Who Can Apply:

Primary Care, Mental Health, and Dental Providers, Including: Physicians, Dentists, Dental Hygienists, Registered Nurses, Midwives, Advanced Practice Nurses & Physician Assistants

The HPLRP will issue up to eleven (11) award contracts. Award contracts will cover two years of participation and award contract amounts will be equivalent to 44 percent of a provider's total eligible debt - up to a maximum of \$72,617.88 for physicians and up to \$39,938.83 for all other eligible primary care providers. The maximum award amount for four years of service is \$165,040.64 for medical doctors and dentists and \$90,770.07 for all other approved DC licensed providers.

New provider applications will be accepted from March 15, 2024 to April 15, 2024.

Additional Information:

Providers interested in the program must be employed or have an employment contract with a certified Service Obligation Site (SOS) to provide direct patient care for at least 20 hours per week. A site must be an approved SOS for a provider to be eligible for the HPLRP. To become an SOS, a site must be a public or nonprofit entity located in a Health Professional Shortage or Medically Under-served Area/Population (HPSA/MUA/MUP) and must submit a Site Certification Application to the HPLRP. HPLRP applications, including recommendation letters and loan verification information, must be completed and received by DC Health by April 15, 2024.

Providers at for-profit facilities are newly eligible. See the website for details.

The anticipated contract start date for selected applicants is August 2024.
