Letter from DC Dental Society President Cheryle Baptiste, DDS, FICD, FIAMDI

On January 14, 2025, the gavel will officially pass to Dr. Hillary Abel, who I know will lead our Society with passion and dedication.

The month of January holds special significance with events that resonate deeply with our profession and our community. As we observe **Martin Luther King Jr. Day** on January 20, let us reflect on his unwavering commitment to equality and service. Later in the month, we celebrate **National Fluoride Day** on January 25 and **Dental Drill Appreciation Day** on January 26, both of which highlight the tools and practices that have transformed dental care. Additionally, the **4th week of January is Medical Group Practice Week**, a time to recognize the value of collaboration in healthcare.

Looking back on 2024, I am immensely proud of the strides we have made together. Early in the year, DCDS adopted a new strategic plan focused on growth and supporting members in key areas:

- **Strong Membership**: Recognizing the power of unity, we initiated efforts to strengthen our membership base, including participating in a three-year ADA pilot program to provide members with customizable benefits and reduced dues.

Important DC Licensing Update

Board of Dentistry Announces Incentivized Time Period For Registration of Dental Assistants Through April 30

The DC Board of Dentistry recently adopted a temporary policy to reduce the monetary penalties on unregistered dental assistants who work in DC when they apply to register following a specified process. The registration application must be accompanies by the "Incentivized Dental Assistant Registration Application Cover Letter" and the "Unregistered Practice Admission and Agreement."

Under the policy, a monetary penalty of \$250 will be assessed on a dental assistant who applies to register with the Board of Dentistry and a monetary penalty of \$500 will be assessed on the supervisory dentist or dental practice owner for each unregistered dental assistant. The person applying to register as a dental assistant as well as the supervisory dentist or dental practice owner will be required to complete two credit hours in Board-approved continuing education in ethics. The incentivized policy and reduced penalties are in effect until April 30. **Outside of the incentivized period, the monetary penalties can range as high as \$5,000 for dental assistants and \$30,000 for dentists**, depending on the number of years of non-compliance, if the Board of Dentistry identifies an non-registered dental assistant working in a practice in the District. Update from the ADA (in case you missed it)

Requirement to file Beneficial Owners Information with Dept. of Treasury Blocked by Federal Court

The Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals panel reinstated the nationwide injunction against the Corporate Transparency Act (CTA) Dec. 26. Impacted small businesses are therefore no longer required to comply with the law's reporting requirements until further proceedings take place.

"In order to preserve the constitutional status quo while the merits panel considers the parties' weighty substantive arguments, that part of the motions-panel order granting the government's motion to stay the district court's preliminary injunction enjoining enforcement of the [Corporate Transparency Act] and the Reporting Rule is vacated," reads the ruling.

The panel announced it would hear arguments March 25, 2025 on whether to keep the injunction in place while the broader case is heard by the full court. This means the injunction will likely stay in place through March 2025 and businesses will not be required to file beneficial ownership reports until then, at the earliest.

Note that this latest action comes after the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas enjoined the federal government from enforcing the CTA on December 3, and then on December 23, a Fifth Circuit panel granted an emergency motion from the DOJ to stay the nationwide injunction.
